### Let's get ready to vote!

Our Grant Review Committees have been hard at work these last months studying applications, attending site visits, and considering which of the many wonderful proposals they will present to members at our Meet the Finalists event on April 20.

For this, our 15th anniversary year, we'll award a record \$350,000 in funding. In addition to awarding at least 13 Impetus Grants, we are very excited to launch our new Encore Grant program, which will award one Impetus Grant recipient a second year of funding in the same amount. The Encore Grant recipient also will have the option to select one woman from among its staff, board, or volunteers to become a fully paid, voting member of Impact100 Sonoma for two years.

Because grant voting includes this new component, we encourage you to review the voting instructions **HERE**. The process for making your Impetus Grant and Encore Grant selections will become clear when you receive your online ballot via ElectionBuddy.

We always recommend that Meet the Finalists event attendees bring tissues, as well as a pencil or pen for annotating the printed program. But even if you can't attend, you can still choose with confidence. Starting the same day, you'll be able to access full proposal summaries in the Member Portal of our website, linked via the home page or your ElectionBuddy email.

# **Spotlight Series Continues with Focus on Status of Sonoma County Women**

On March 28, in honor of Women's History Month, some 37 attendees welcomed **Joanne M. Brown**, MSW, JD, from the Commission on the Status of Women in Sonoma County to the Pueblo Serena Clubhouse. She summarized the advisory panel's role, history, and current initiatives. She also presented key findings from the **2020 Voices of Sonoma County Women Report** and stressed the importance of the **Sonoma County Child Care & Children's Health Initiative**, a November ballot measure.

**Joanne Brown** offered this advice for amplifying our voices: continue to be active in Impact100 Sonoma; don't neglect your interests, which contain unrecognized skills; watch for implicit bias in work that comes before you; volunteer in schools and help young women see a path ahead; get involved in local government; and read your local newspapers and hold them accountable.

The Sonoma Valley native and daughter of Mexican immigrants will be the first Latina to serve on the Sonoma County Board of Supervisors when she succeeds **Susan Gorin** in 2025.
